

Oor Wullie's Bucket Trail

We are delighted to announce that Ferryhill's 'Oor Wullie' is now on his journey to join more than 150 human-sized Oor Wullie sculptures as part of the 'Oor Wullie BIG Bucket Trail.'

A major nationwide fundraising campaign for Edinburgh Children's Hospital Charity, ARCHIE Foundation and Glasgow Hospital Charity, the sculptures will soon be taking to the streets of Edinburgh, Glasgow, Dundee, Aberdeen and Inverness.

The Ferryhill Primary School winner, **Lucie Jardine** impressed the jury with her strong narrative and a coherent design and her submission was selected from over ninety entries.

Lucie portrays Oor Wullie, aptly named "Oor Mistakes of 2019", as he might look fifty years from now. Still wearing his trademark black dungarees and carrying his famous catapult, Wullie has clearly matured. He has grown a PC Murdoch-style moustache and his hair is greying. On his back are links to facebook, twitter and youtube, placing him firmly within 21st century culture. His bucket and his pockets feature the colours of the rainbow, a traditional symbol of hope, transformation, inclusion and joy, all of which we celebrate at our school.
