Modern languages – French.

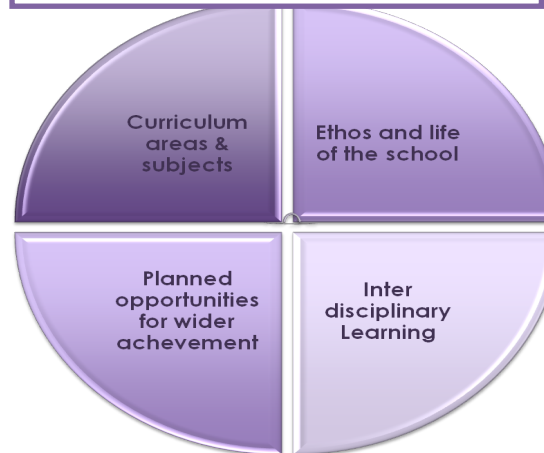
Religious and Moral Education
